



# U.S. Citizenship Application Workshop

## *Information and Documents to Bring*

Please bring the following to the workshop

- A **copy** of your **Permanent Resident Card** (also known as your “green card”) – both sides.
- Two passport-style photos** (2”x2”) of yourself.
- Your **driver’s license** or state identification card.
- Your **Social Security number** (we do not need the card itself).
- The application fee, by **check or money order**, payable to “**U.S. Department of Homeland Security**”, in the amount of **\$680** (if under 75 years of age) or \$595 (if 75 or older).

- A list of your **residences** for the past 5 years.

<i>Address</i>	<i>From (date)</i>	<i>To (date)</i>

- A list of your **employers** (and/or schools) for the past 5 years.

<i>Employer or school</i>	<i>Address</i>	<i>From (date)</i>	<i>To (date)</i>

- A list of **every trip** you’ve taken outside the U.S. (including trips to Canada and Mexico) **SINCE YOU BECAME A PERMANENT RESIDENT** (green card holder). Do not include trips less than 24 hours.

<i>Date left US</i>	<i>Date returned</i>	<i>Countries visited</i>

**If you are now married:**

- Your spouse’s name
- Your spouse’s birth date
- Date of your marriage
- Your spouse’s Social Security number
- Your spouse’s address

**If your spouse naturalized to become a U.S. citizen:**

- Date your spouse became a U.S. citizen (date of naturalization ceremony)
- Place your spouse became a U.S. citizen (place of naturalization ceremony)



**If your spouse is *not* a U.S. citizen:**

- Your spouse's country of citizenship
- Your spouse's A-number (if any)
- Your spouse's immigration status (permanent resident, other)

**If you were married before:**

- Your prior spouse's name
- Your prior spouse's immigration status
- Date of marriage to your prior spouse
- Date of end of marriage to your prior spouse
- Reason for end of marriage (divorce, death, other)

Please provide this information on *all* of your previous marriages.

**If your current spouse was married before:**

- His/her prior spouse's name
- His/her prior spouse's immigration status
- Date of marriage to his/her prior spouse
- Date of end of marriage to his/her prior spouse
- Reason for end of marriage (divorce, death, other)

Please provide this information on *all* of your spouse's previous marriages.

**If you have or ever had children** (including deceased, adopted, step, living overseas, married, etc.):

- Child's name
- Child's birth date
- Child's A-number, if applicable
- Child's country of birth
- Child's current home address

Please provide this information on *all* of your children.

**If you have ever been arrested, cited, charged, detained, jailed, convicted, imprisoned, sentenced, etc., including traffic violations:**

- Date(s) of arrest, citation, or charge
- Place(s) of arrest, citation, or charge
- Police and court records showing arrests, charges, convictions, and penalties (fine, jail, probation, etc.)

**If you have ever been excluded, removed, or deported from the U.S.:**

- Date of exclusion, removal, or deportation proceedings
- Place of exclusion, removal, or deportation proceedings

**If you are a male, you lived in the US at any time from age 18 till your 26<sup>th</sup> birthday, and you registered with Selective Service:**

- Your Selective Service number and registration date (available from [www.sss.gov](http://www.sss.gov))

**If you want to apply for a fee waiver:**

- Most recent tax return forms with all W2s, attachments, and schedules
- Official letter from government, if you receive any government benefits
  - o Attach a letter, notice or other official document that shows: 1) the name of the person receiving the benefit and 2) the name of the agency that is providing the benefit
